As the year draws to a conclusion, there is one more meeting remaining to elect a new Executive, culminated by the Commodores Ball at which time members will be recognized for their contributions to the club.

There was an excellent turnout for the meeting in part due to the record setting warm September weather, and the fact that unfortunately it is time to prepare boats for the coming winter months.





- Power washing of your boat is to take place south of the well so as not to disturb members dock areas and no acid is to be used while boat is on the travel lift.
- Remember to put your stairs, dock poles and all other equipment away with your boat or in the south yard storage area.
- UNPLUG YOUR BOAT do not unplug any other members boat!
- When KYC equipment has been winterized it will have a tag on it "WINTERIZED" do not use the equipment or you may have to buy the club a new unit.
- It takes a significant amount of time to winterize the water systems, please do not use them after they have been winterized as it takes a lot of time and money to fix/ repair it in the spring.
- If you are the last one on the property anytime, be sure to make sure **ALL club** house doors and the garage doors are closed and locked.
- Don't forget if you see a maintenance problem small or large, report it to the incoming Rear Commodore (Dale Pritcher) or any other member of the Executive immediately so that it can be addressed before it becomes a major problem.
- If you changed your oil, **remember to put the used oil in the collection tank**, located in the southeast corner of the south storage yard.

Email proxies are to be submitted to the KYC Secretary no fewer than ten (10) days prior to the meeting i.e by November14th, from the email address you use regularly for KYC correspondence, using the format below.

KYC elections and other matters are decided by secret ballot. The proxy form must not state how you have instructed your proxy to vote.
